

10 Year Old Mason girl auctions the season's hottest Christmas gift to benefit Dragonfly

A Mason girl gave up 2016's hottest holiday toy to raise money for kids with cancer.

Young Kelly Barto was looking for a way to raise money for The Dragonfly Foundation, when her mother had an inspired idea.

Her mother, Lisa Barto, had bought Kelly a Hatchimal for Christmas — back before it became a holiday craze. The demand for the \$60 toy exceeded supply, and soon it began selling on eBay and other websites for \$200 or more. Instead of taking a profit, Barto thought any amount raised would be a nice donation for the foundation! When she brought the idea to her daughter, Kelly decided that's what she would do!

Barto posted photos of the Hatchimal on Facebook asking for bids that morning, and 36 hours later, bidding had reached \$500.

"We're very fortunate, and my kids know it," said Barto. "I know it was a hard decision for her, and I'm proud of her. It's nice to see her step out of her privilege and think about others."

When the bidding ended Kelly had raised \$600 for The Dragonfly Foundation! More than that, Kelly's story was picked up by WLWT TV5, WXIX TV19, and WLW, and was shared thousands of times on social media. The awareness she helped raise for Dragonfly is priceless! (Thank you, Kelly & Lisa!)
