I Am Still Me Program: This initiative aids patients in coping with the challenging effects of chemotherapy and hair loss, fostering resilience and self-acceptance.

**Community Building:** Dragonfly hosts a variety of events, including the Dragonfly Holiday Party at the Great American Ball Park, Kings Island Day, Summer Bash, and numerous others. These gatherings offer families an opportunity to connect, share their experiences, and enjoy moments of togetherness.

**Providing Resources and Entertainment:** Dragonfly ensures access to a wide range of activities, from sporting events to concert tickets, enabling patients and families to participate in enjoyable experiences within a secure environment. 



## WHO WE SERVE


#### The Dragonfly Foundation serves families from across America and beyond.

#### WHO WE SERVE LOCALLY


The majority of families served comes from Ohio, Kentucky, and Indiana.



## 2022 FINANCIALS






#### **Operational Donations Trend (thousands)**
