This partnership has allowed us to integrate our support directly into the hospital environment and beyond, ensuring that families receive the care they need when they need it most.

Community Engagement

- Events and Activities: We hosted over 40 events, engaging over 1,000 participants. These included family days at the Cincinnati Zoo, Cyclones and Reds games, as well as concerts and other family events. And, of course, we all came together to enjoy the incredible Stricker's Grove Family Day and the Annual Dragonfly Holiday Party at Great American Ballpark. All events are designed to bring joy and foster connection.

Looking ahead In 2024, we aim to expand our programs to reach even more families.
